- WHEREAS: It has come to the attention of this City Council that Mrs. Viola Allston, a long time Cambridge resident, will celebrate her nintieth birthday today, October 15th; and
- WHEREAS: Viola (Jackson) Allston was born in 1894 in Lewiston, Nova Scotia, Canada, and although she had six brothers and four sisters, she is the sole surviving sibling of her entire family; and
- WHEREAS: Viola was married during World War I to the late Ezekial Harnish and during their union were blessed with a daughter named Aurelia; and
- WHEREAS: Viola and Aurelia, after Ezekial's death, moved to Cambridge in 1936 and she later married the late William Allston, and that union blessed them with two daughters named Wilma and Karyll; a union which brought together two people who possessed a tremendous amount of compassion for their fellow man, particularly for children, having raised several of their own and of others, including Princetta (Tiny) Biggers, Joyce and Paul Kieling; and
- WHEREAS: Viola has, in her own quiet way, touched many hearts and lives throughout her forty-eight year residency in Cambridge and has taught the meaning of trust and giving to many people who have come to call her "Nana" because of her love and devotion to all of them; now therefore be it

- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Viola on behalf of the entire City Council.

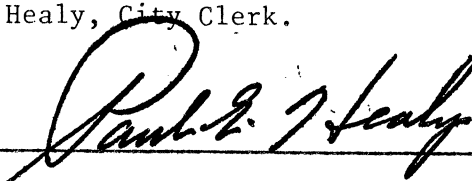
