- WHEREAS: On Monday, November 21, 1988, there will be a celebration of the Rindge Technical School 100th Anniversary; and
- WHEREAS: This school, named after Frederick Hastings Rindge, a philanthropist and collector, born December 21, 1857, died August 29, 1905, was originally called the Cambridge Manuel Training School for Boys; and
- WHEREAS: Frederick Rindge inherited three million dollars in 1887 from his father and then donated part of these funds to establish a Public Library in Cambridge with 141,000 square feet of land; a school for Manuel Training and a City Hall, calling these "his didactic public buildings". Rindge's religious tendencies were strong and are enscribed on various parts of his buildings; and
- WHEREAS: Frederick Rindges' coin collection is located in the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston; and
- WHEREAS: Frederick Rindge was proud of his New England origin; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That I, Alfred E. Vellucci, Mayor of the City of Cambridge, congratulate the Rindge Technical Alumni Association on the celebration of its 100th Anniversary; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to be presented to John F. Rindge, Grandson of Frederick Rindge.

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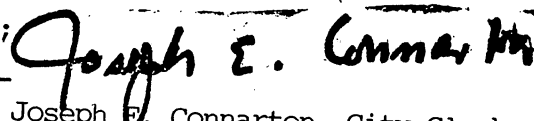
