COUNCILLOR WALSH

WHEREAS: Attention has been called to the fact that a good number of residential and commercial properties throughout the City do not have clear and conspicuous numerical markings at their front doors to indicate a specific address on a particular street. In addition to other negative results, this deficiency creates delay on the part of police, fire and other emergency personnel to respond as quickly as possible to emergency calls; and

WHEREAS: To develop an expeditious and enduring remedy for this problem involving minimal inconvenience and aggravation to property owners is a must; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager take the necessary steps to arrange for preparation of a notice to residential and commercial property owners wherein this problem will be brought to their attention and asking them to assure the presence of clear, conspicuous, well-positioned and easily identifiable numerical markings at the front door of their properties as a means for increasing the rapidity of response time by emergency vehicles. Further, that the City Manager take steps to assure that effective January 1, 1992 and henceforth thereafter, this notice/reminder be enclosed with the tax and/or water bills when the latter are mailed to property owners or, at least once on a regular annual basis; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager report back to the Council as soon as possible on this, providing a copy of the prepared enclosure and confirming that the date for mailing the initial notices has been finalized.
