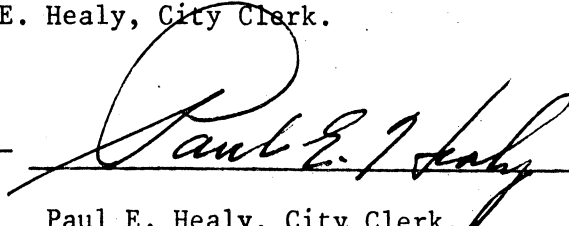
COUNCILLOR WALTER SULLIVAN

- WHEREAS: This City Council was saddened upon learning of the death of Hugh F. O'Rourke, former Executive Secretary for the Boston Fisheries Association and long-time Cambridge resident; and
- WHEREAS: Hugh had served the Fisheries Association for twenty years with dedication, pride and integrity, distinguishing himself many times during his career as an able spokesman and lobbyist, a position he truly enjoyed, particularly when a project he had been working on was successfully completed, such as his efforts to establish a two hundred mile fishing limit; and
- WHEREAS: Hugh also represented the fishing industry at international conferences in Ireland, Sweden and Canada and only last year, worked with members of Congress on plans to reconstruct the Northern Avenue Bridge by the Fish Pier; and
- WHEREAS: During Mr. O'Rourke's busy career as an executive at General Electric prior to representing the fishing industry, he found time to participate in activities of the Handel and Haydn Society, as well as the Clover Club; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deep sympathy to Hugh's sister Rose, Administrative Assistant to the Superintendent of Schools and to her sister Mary Procopio, as well as to the entire family; and be it further
