ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to sit down and negotiate with the Cambridge Police Association and remain at the bargaining table all day until a settlement to their contract dispute is reached, and be it further

ORDERED: That should these negotiations fail, in settling this long standing labor/management dispute, I, Alfred E. Vellucci will submit to the City Council a proposal to amend the General Ordinances of the City of Cambridge which will grant a pay raise to the members of the Police Department which will be equivalent to what other city employees have received since July 1, 1976.
