- Whereas: Certain questions have been raised incidental to the proposed sale of City owned land to F. W. Dixon and the Daggett Chocolate Co., and
- Whereas: Chapter 40 Sec 15 of the General Laws requires certain steps of procedure before certain parcels of land owned by the City might be sold, and
- Whereas: No information is available at this time as to whether said procedure has been complied with in the cases above referred to or in certain previous cases, therefore

INCREASE

Be it ordered: That the City Solicitor be requested to give an opinion as to whether or not it is necessary to have notice in writing from an officer or head of Department so referred to in Chapter 40, Section 15 of the General Laws, when land is released for a public use by any Department, and further

Be it ordered: That the City Solicitor be required to inform the City Council whether or not Chapter 40, Sec. 15 applies to proposed orders of sale of land to Dixon and Daggett, and further

~~Be it ordered: That the City Solicitor be requested to examine the descriptions in deeds of City of Cambridge to the Daggett Co. on August 14, 1925 and Sept. 24, 1925, also description in order reported this date by the Committee on Public Property regarding sale of additional City owned land to the Daggett Co., with a view of determining the proper description of land already conveyed, or of land proposed to be conveyed to said Daggett Co., and to ascertain if there is a discrepancy in measurements especially in frontage on Main Street.~~

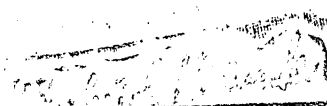
