COUNCILLOR DAVID SULLIVAN

WHEREAS: The attached advertisement, which appears on page 39 of the current (October 27) Boston Phoenix, strongly suggests that supporters of Proposition 1-2-3 are again planning to import out-of-town mercenaries to deceive Cambridge voters at the polls, as they did a year ago when collecting signatures on their initiative petition; and

WHEREAS: Such tactics, although legal, threaten to drown the authentic voices of Cambridge citizens in a torrent of paid sloganeering, financed by wealthy members of the real estate industry, many of whom also do not reside in or vote in Cambridge; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That regardless of our respective views on the merits of Proposition 1-2-3, the Cambridge City Council strongly disapproves of the real estate industry's attempts to "buy" this election using paid out-of-town temporary workers ignorant of Cambridge citizens and issues, and calls on all campaigns to rely on the good judgment of Cambridge voters on election day.
