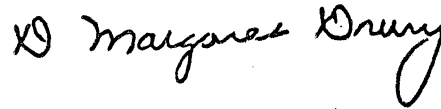

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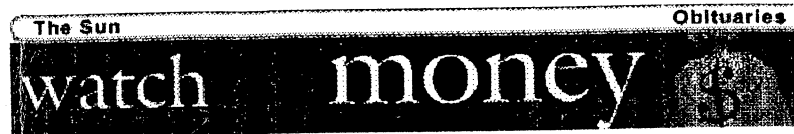

Kevin Mahoney, 74, a former longtime resident of Lowell, died yesterday afternoon, April 11, at Saints Memorial Medical Center in Lowell after a long illness. He was the husband of M. Isabelle (Guerin) Mahoney.

He was born in Lowell on July 8, 1924, the son of the late Lowell police Officer Timothy G. Mahoney and the late Anna (Regan) Mahoney.

He was a graduate of Lowell High School and Lowell Trade School. He had been employed as a sheet metal supervisor at Standard Thompson in Waltham for 20 years, and then by the Glenview Sheet Metal Co. in Lowell for 20 years. After his retirement in 1987, he continued as a consultant to Glenview.

He was a communicant of St. William's Church, and was formerly of the Immaculate Conception Church, where he was an active leader in the Cub Scouts.
