IN BOARD OF ALDERMEN, May 4, 1887.

WHEREAS, In the opinion of this Board, the public necessity and convenience require that Winsor Street should be extended from its present southerly terminus across Main Street to a private way called State Street, by taking for such purpose, certain parcels of land as shown on a plan prepared by the City Engineer, to wit, a strip of land forty feet in width between said Main Street and said State Street, the western boundary thereof to begin at the northeasterly corner of the brick block, standing on the southerly side of said Main Street, and thence to extend along the easterly line of said block and in a straight line beyond said block to said State Street.

Such extension to be made under the provisions of Chapter 51 of the Public Statutes in relation to betterments. It is therefore hereby

ORDERED, That due notice be given to the owners and abutters on the line of said extension, and all other persons interested, that this Board intends to extend said street by taking said land and laying out the same as a public street; and that WEDNESDAY, the 25th day of May next, at 8 o'clock P. M., is assigned as the time for hearing any objections that may be made thereto.
