In Board of Aldermen, Dec. 28. 1897.

Resolved, that the public necessity and convenience require that Winsor Street, shall be extended from its southerly terminus, crossing Main Street, to a private way called State Street, by taking for such purpose certain parcels of land shown on a plan prepared by the city engineer, dated December 6. 1886, said land being bounded and described as follows: Beginning on the southerly line of Main Street, at a point nearly opposite the easterly end of the brick block now or late of Moses A. Dow, and thence extending by a line at right angles with the said southerly line of Main Street, and passing at a distance of one-tenth of a foot from the south-east corner of said brick block, a distance of One-hundred and eighty-seven and ninety-eight one-hundredths (187.98) linear feet to State Street: thence running easterly on the northerly line of State Street, a distance of forty (40) feet: thence turning and running northerly by a line parallel with and forty (40) feet distant from the first described line of such extension, a distance of One-hundred and eighty-seven and ninety-one one-hundredths (187.91) linear feet to Main Street.

thence running westerly on the southerly line of Main Street, Forty (40) feet to the point of beginning; said land comprising an area of seventy-five hundred and seventeen and seven-tenths (7,517.7) square feet, ^{more or less,} and that the grade of the said proposed extension of Winsor Street shall be established; and for that purpose it is necessary to take and lay out as a public street or way of the said city, with the name of Winsor Street, a parcel of land belonging to the estate now or formerly of Moses A. Dow, bounded as follows: Beginning on the southerly line of Main Street, at the northeasterly corner of the premises ^{now or late} of said Dow: thence running southerly by a line at right angles with main street, and bounding on land of heirs of Samuel Woodward, One hundred and eighty seven and ninety-seven one-hundredths (187.97) feet, to State Street; thence running westerly by the northerly line of State Street, Four and three-one hundredths (4.03) feet: thence running northerly by a line parallel with, and Four and three-one hundredths (4.03) feet distant westerly from the division line between the land of Dow and the land of Woodward, One Hundred and eighty-seven and ninety-eight one hundredths (187.98) feet to Main Street: thence running easterly by the southerly line of Main Street, Four and three-one hundredths feet (4.03) to the point of beginning, the land to be so taken from the estate of said Dow, containing an area of seven hundred and fifty seven and five-tenths (757.5) square feet, more or less; a parcel of land belonging to the heirs of Samuel Woodward, bounded as follows: Beginning on the southerly line

of Main Street, at the northwesterly corner of the premises, now a
lot of Samuel Woodward; thence ^{running} southerly by a line at right angles
with Main Street, One hundred and eighty seven and ninety seven
one-hundredths (187.97) feet to State Street; thence running
easterly on the northerly line of State Street Thirty-five and ninety-
seven one-hundredths, (35.97) feet: thence turning and running
northerly by a line parallel with and Thirty five and ninety-
seven one-hundredths (35.97) feet distant from the dividing line
between the estates now or late of Dow and now a lot of
Woodward, One hundred and eighty seven, and ninety one-
one-hundredths (187.91) feet to Main Street: thence
running westerly on the southerly line of Main Street, Thirty five
and ninety-seven one-hundredths (35.97) feet to point of
beginning, containing an area of Sixty seven Hundred and
Sixty and two-tenths, (6760.2) square feet, more or less.
and

Whereas, due notice has been given of the intention of this
board to take the said parcels of land for the purpose aforesaid
as appears by the return on the order of notice, issued
therefor, it is therefore,
Ordered,

That the several parcels of land before described, be and
the same hereby are taken and laid out under the provisions of
law authorizing the assessment of betterments, as a public street
or way of the said City, with the name of Winsor Street, and the
grade thereof is established according to a plan of the said
extension, and profile of the grade, made by W. P. Barton,

city engineer, dated December 6, 1886, and deposited in his office, - and this board doth adjudge that the expense of extending and establishing the ^{grade of the} said extension of Winsen street as aforesaid will amount to the sum of Eight Hundred and Eighty Dollars (\$880.-), and the damages to the estates, parts or the whole of which are taken as above, are the sums set against them, respectively, in the Schedule hereinafter given, to wit:
