Copy of Plff's Declaration.

"and Plff. says that he is the owner of a certain piece or parcel of land situated in that part of Cambridge called Cambridgeport - lying upon the Easterly side of a street called Court-Street, & bounded & described as follows, to wit: - "Beginning on the North Westely front of Charles River, at the North Easterly corner of land now or formerly of Mason & Brooks; thence North Westely, bounded South Westely by said Mason & Brooks land, to said Court-Street; thence Northely, bounded Westely in said Court-Street, eighty-four feet & six inches; thence Easterly by a line parallel to the first-described line to Charles River; then South Westely by said River eighty-four feet six inches to the place of beginning."

Court St.

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and Peff. says Left. holes & entered Peff's said close
& upon the portion lying along upon said Court Street
made & erected a plank walk & opened the same
for a public walk a way & dug up the ground
the entire front along said street & set posts there
in & fastened rails & boards upon said posts, &
he cut off Peff from any passing across his said
land to said street or from said street to said
land.

And Peff. says Left. has kept and continued
& still keeps and continues said obstruction upon
his said close & obstructs Peff. in the use of the
same & still encumbers said close with said walk
so built & said posts so set against the will of
Peff. & without any consent or permission from
Peff. so to do.
