- WHEREAS: December 10, 1985 is International Human Rights Day, the 37th anniversary of the United Nation's Universal Declaration of Human Rights; and
- WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge has a long tradition of support for the human rights of all people both locally and throughout the world; and
- WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge has demonstrated this tradition by declaring Cambridge to be a Sanctuary City; and
- WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge has further demonstrated this tradition by establishing city agencies to promote the interests of minorities, women, handicapped and the elderly; and
- WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge has declared discrimination on the basis of race, color, sex, age, religious creed, disability, national origin or ancestry, sexual orientation, marital status, family status, military status or source of income to be unlawful; and
- WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge has created the Cambridge Human Rights Commission to protect the human rights of people discriminated against; and
- WHEREAS: The advancement of people's human rights require the positive commitment, involvement and support of each one of our citizens; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council proclaims December 10, 1985 as

HUMAN RIGHTS DAY

in Cambridge and urges all citizens to take note of this event and to participate fittingly in its observance.
