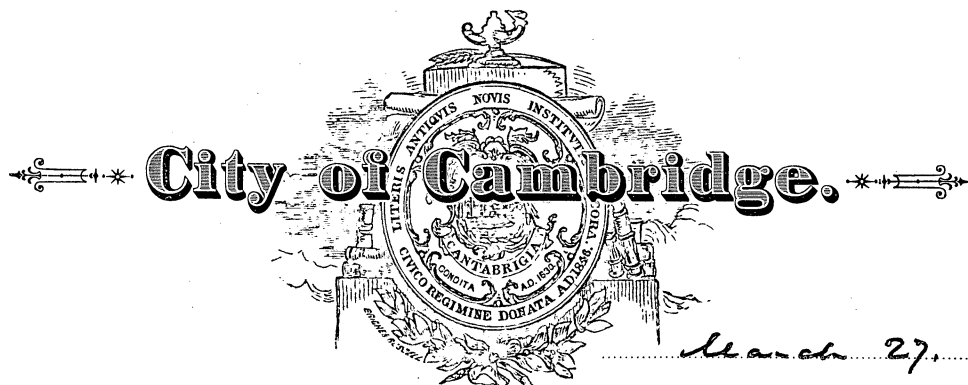

In Water Board.

Voted.

That the City Council be requested to consider what arrangements can be made for obtaining water for the watering of streets, during the ensuing season, elsewhere than from the pipes of the Water Works:— for the reason that the water in Fresh Pond is now only one foot and an inch above the conduit,— whereas at this time last year it was four feet above the conduit.

The quantity required for watering streets is about one tenth of the daily consumption, and amounted last year to 40, 878, 000 gallons,— an average of 270, 000 gallons per day.—
