Such conduct on the part of police officers should not be allowed to pass without receiving proper recognition from the citizens of our city, it is

ORDERED:

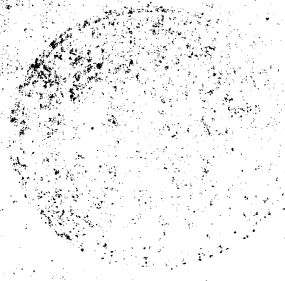
