Subject Fort Washington Area Roadway Improvements

The City is currently involved in construction of roadway improvements on Waverly Street, in front of American Science and Engineering and Fort Washington Park. At the August City Council meeting, the Council did not grant a request for curb cuts for the parcels of land adjacent to Fort Washington. The request was submitted by MIT who owns the properties, but it was submitted to comply with the City's construction plans. There is no curb there now whatsoever, therefore making vehicular access possible along the entire length of both parcels.

The City would very much like to set curbs there as part of the roadway work now in progress. However, since the owner is entitled to access to the parcels, we cannot install curbing unless the City Council authorizes the curb cuts.

I am therefore requesting that the Council be provided with this background information so that they can take the necessary action to allow the work to proceed as planned.

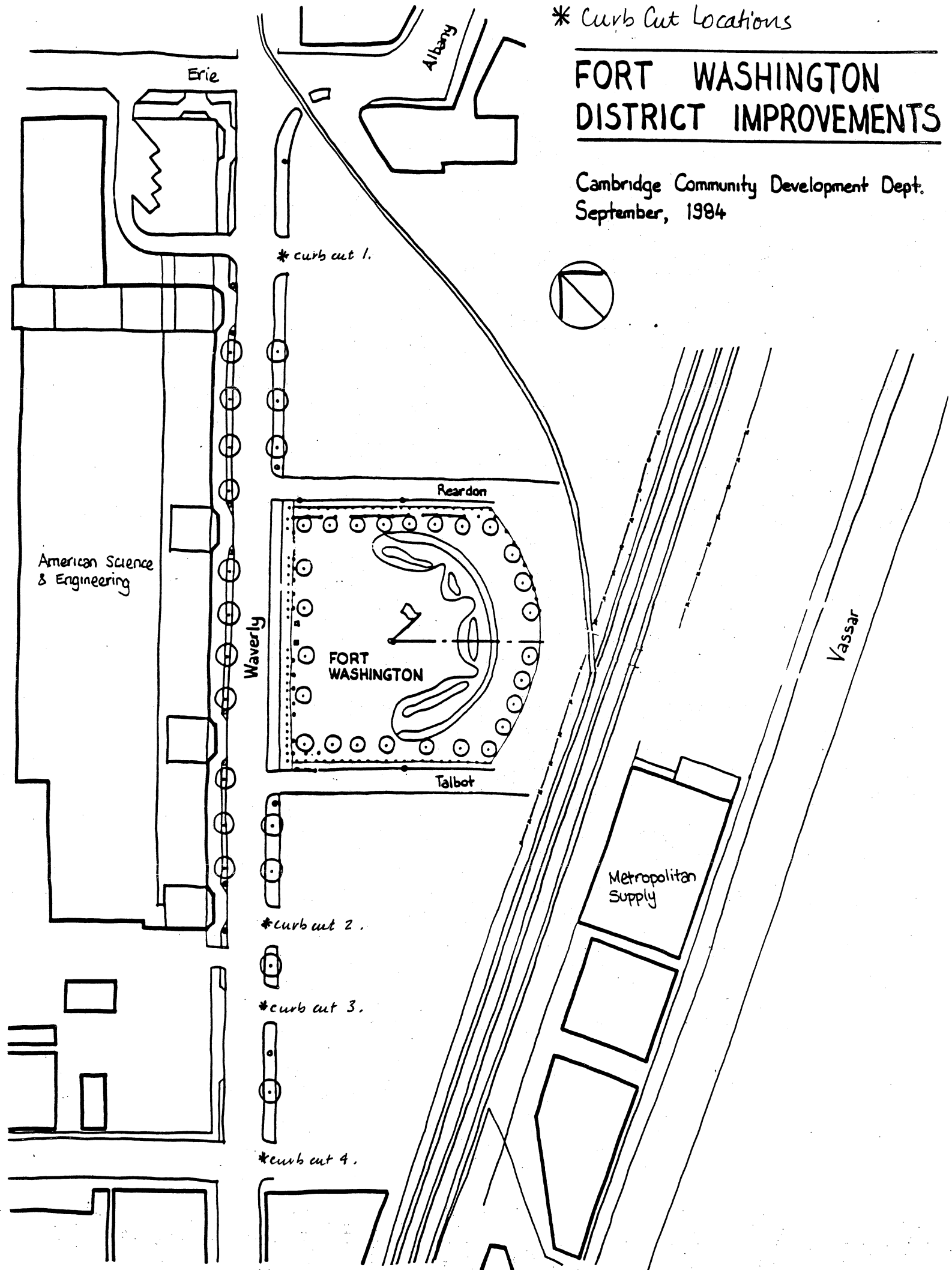
