In the year One thousand eight hundred & fifty eight

An Ordinance

Establishing the salary of the City Clerk.

As it is ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge, as follows:-

Sect. 1. The City Clerk shall receive, exclusive of fees established by law, - an annual salary of One Thousand Dollars, in equal quarterly payments, commencing from the first day of April last past; which shall be in full for all services rendered by him in his official capacity.

Sect. 2. So much of an ordinance in relation to the salaries of City officers, in the Municipal Register, Page One hundred and twenty seven, as relates to the City Clerk, is hereby repealed.
