- WHEREAS: Elderly residents of the L.B.J. Apartments on Erie Street must now wait for the No. 47 bus to Central Square in the open air at the corner of Brookline Street; and
- WHEREAS: The MBTA has been approached about building an enclosed bus shelter, but the use of a small portion of the Acme Glass parking lot is required at this location; and
- WHEREAS: The construction of such a shelter has won the support of neighborhood organizations, including the Ward 5 Democratic Committee; therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council urge Acme Plate and Windor Glass, Inc. to cooperate with the MBTA and the neighborhood in allowing construction of this bus shelter; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager, through the Community Development Department, transmit the City Council's sentiments to Acme Glass, attempt to facilitate this important project, and report the results to the City Council as soon as possible.
