Ordered,

The Joint Standing Committee on Roads and Bridges, which was instructed to consider and report what provision should be made for the giving of notice to the city, before the work is begun, - when a street is opened, as mentioned in the second paragraph of Section 16 of Chapter 36 of the Revised Ordinances, -

Reports

Recommending the adoption of accompanying amendment to the section aforesaid, the same providing that proper notice of the opening of any street shall be filed in the City Engineer's office, and that through that officer the Superintendent of Streets and Chief Engineer of the Fire Department shall be informed of the fact. Also, that parties making such openings shall be held responsible for any damage resulting therefrom, for six months from the time when said openings are made.

That the Joint Standing Committee on Roads and Bridges be instructed to consider and report what provision should be made for the giving of notice to the City, before the work is begun, when a street is opened, as mentioned in the second paragraph of Section 16 of Chapter 36 of the Revised Ordinances: - to the end that there may be a complete record of the time when, and the person by whom, the work is done, so that the Superintendent of Streets may discharge the duties imposed upon him in the last paragraph of said section, and that it may be known who is liable for accidents that may happen during the progress of the work.
