The Cambridge Conservation feels that a City Council vote at this time relative to the construction of the Kennedy Library and Museum is premature.

The whole purpose of the National Environmental Policy Act that was signed into law in 1970 is to ensure that environmental quality will be considered on an equal footing with all other considerations for Federal projects such as this. In other words, the Environmental Impact Statement is required by law and the Council should respect this fact by voting after the results are in.

Dear Mayor Sullivan:

The League of Women Voters is very much opposed to the Council's voting to support the Kennedy Library and Museum construction. The Federal government requires by law that an Environmental Impact Statement be completed before the GSA can begin work. It is our hope that the EIS will fairly and completely assess the impact on Cambridge and its people. In any event, it is the only official mechanism whereby the environmental effects can be determined.

For the Council to feel that it can second guess the EIS and tell the people of Cambridge that there will be no adverse environmental impact on them and their City is unfortunate. For this reason we urge that the vote wait until after the study is completed.
