WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened at learning of the death of Reverend Antonine DeGuglielmo, OFM, an official of the Franciscan Order; and

WHEREAS: This native Cantabrigian, was a renowned Scripture Scholar, earning the degrees of doctor of sacred theology and lector of sacred scripture from the University of St. Anthony in Rome and the Franciscan Biblical Institute in Jerusalem; and

WHEREAS: Reverend DeGuglielmo, from 1938-1945, was a professor of sacred scripture and biblical language at the Theology Department of St. Francis Seraphic Seminary in Andover and from 1946-1952 taught at the Theology faculty of Mount Alvernia Seminary in Wappingers Falls, New York, and

WHEREAS: Reverend DeGuglielmo returned to Rome from 1952-1954 to finish requirements needed to earn a degree of doctor of sacred scripture; and

WHEREAS: Reverend DeGuglielmo was elected in 1955 to the position of provincial definitor of the Franciscan Order and in 1957 was elected general definitor where he served as advisor to the superior general and member of the governing board of the Order; and

WHEREAS: Reverend DeGuglielmo, as an expert in Semitic languages, served as an associate editor and translator for the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine from 1947-1957; and

WHEREAS: Reverend DeGuglielmo and 51 other scholars assisted in the publication of the 1970 translation of the New American Bible; and

WHEREAS: Reverend DeGuglielmo also served as editor of the Chronicles of the Order for the Province of the Immaculate Conception; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the DeGuglielmo family and the Franciscan community at this time of such personal loss; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the DeGuglielmo family on behalf of the entire City Council.
