Ordered, That the City Clerk be directed to compute and prepare, before the next meeting of the Board, an assessment of the expense of grading Fourth Street between Charles & Vine Streets and Charles Street between Corn & Fifth Streets upon the owners of the estates abutting on said Fourth and Charles Streets, in proportion to the extent of the lines of said estates on said Fourth and Charles Streets, according to a plan drawn by Joseph Whitney, and now in possession of the Board.

City of Cambridge Dec 30th 1857

By orders of the Board of Aldermen
passed September the 15th 1857 the
Mayor and Superintendent of Streets
were authorized to cause plans
to be made showing the amount
of filling that would be required
to grade Otis street from seventh to Eighth
street, also of Fifth street from Spring
to Charles, of Charles street from Fifth
to Sixth street and of Fourth street
from Spring to Charles streets and
to contract with some suitable
person or persons to grade the same.

Under these orders the surveys
and estimates were made and
contracts were entered into for
grading the same at three dollars
per square ^{foot} but as the work is not completed
I would recommend that the
further consideration ^{of the same} be referred to
the next City Council
