WHEREAS: "Jimmy" as he was known to so many of his friends served his country during World War II as a member of the United States Navy; and

WHEREAS: Detective Viliott was a strong advocate for the average patrol officer and served as Recording Secretary to the Police Association, a position he enjoyed and performed well; and

WHEREAS: While serving the City of Cambridge with dedication Detective Viliott recognized the complex job he had and therefore applied, was accepted and graduated from Boston College receiving a Master's Degree in Public Administration; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending our deepest sympathy to Mrs. James Viliott at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
