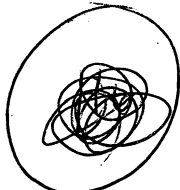

John J. Dwyer, at 65, of Arlington, inspector

John J. "Dewey" Dwyer of Arlington, an inspector at Western Electric Co., died Sunday after a lengthy illness at Massachusetts General Hospital, Boston. He was 65.

Born in Cambridge, he attended St. John's High School in North Cambridge.

Mr. Dwyer was a supervisor before he became an inspector at Western Electric.

He served in the Army after 1955.

Mr. Dwyer was a semi-professional baseball player in North Cambridge for several

years.

He is survived by two daughters, Donna Yunes of Derry, N.H., and Laura Keeley of Chelmsford; two sons, Scott of Somerville and Stephen of Tewksbury; a sister, Mary Convery of Arlington; six grandchildren; and many nephews and nieces.

A funeral Mass will be celebrated tomorrow at 10 a.m. in St. Agnes' Church, Arlington.
