To the Committee on Front
St. Public Property - -
- Gentlemen -

Having had time since the
meeting of last Tuesday to look
more carefully into the subject
concerning my Estate (No 30.
Front St. southerly side), I am
able to submit for your consideration
a proposition which will be
better for the City financially than
the one I submitted at the last
meeting, I herewith submit an
Estimate of the Cost to the City
of moving my House and leaving
it in as good condition as now
raising & moving Building \$75.00
Digging for Cellar - 25.00
stone & brick condensing
with repairs to Chimneys. 200.00

Cellar doors windows & frames
" floor coal line and repair
to water & drain pipes with
other repairs to plastering & ~~plaster~~ paper
necessarily caused by moving the
building - \$100.00

Total. \$400.00

This I think is about as cheap
as it can be done. . . .
now I propose if the City will
pay me \$300.00. and protect
me from all betterment -
assessments that may come up
in the future, I will let my
House remain where it now
stands, but take away my
bay window (first story only)
& front door and put them
around on the side of the
House and so remodel my
House that I can get and Entrance
in that direction.

This will incur a lot of tearing
out the inside of the House and
so cost money. I agree also
to move my fences and
give the City the strip of
land required free and
clear of all obstructions or
incumbrance, if this offer is
not satisfactory to the City, then
I am open to any reasonable
offer that the City may have
to make.
