MAYOR WOLF

- WHEREAS: The railroad crossing at Cambridge and Warren Streets currently has abrupt level changes due to the wearing away of railroad ties; and
- WHEREAS: As a consequence, people with mobility impairments, people who use walking aids, and wheelchair users cannot cross the tracks independently without risk of falling; and
- WHEREAS: Crossing the tracks is a necessity for residents of and visitors to East Cambridge in order to shop, attend medical and other appointments, and generally to circulate in the neighborhood; and
- WHEREAS: Conrail has agreed to make the necessary repairs but has not recognized the urgency of this situation; and
- WHEREAS: The repairs will take three days and disrupt traffic on Cambridge Street, so it is most convenient to have Conrail do the work over a three-day weekend; and
- WHEREAS: Since repair negotiations with Conrail have begun, both Memorial Day weekend and the 4th of July weekend have passed; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council urges Conrail to make the agreed-upon repairs to the Cambridge Street railroad crossing over Labor Day weekend 1991, or at the very least, Columbus Day weekend; and further be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to be sent to the appropriate officials at Conrail.
