WHEREAS: Though our losses have been considerable -- more than one million have died in military service -- it is our sacred duty to keep the legacy of our nation's veterans forever fresh in the memories of future generations; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: On this Veterans' Day, we let our veterans know that their service is not forgotten, that their sacrifices are appreciated, and that we salute our defenders, and we will never forget the men and women of past wars for whom there is still no accounting.

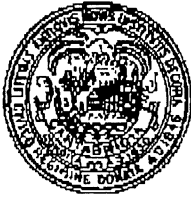
