

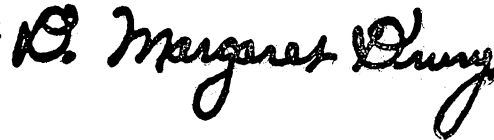

- WHEREAS: October is recognized as Domestic Violence Awareness Month and a time to acknowledge the extent of domestic violence in the city of Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: The Cambridge Community Partnerships for Children, in response to disclosure of partner violence to staff of child care centers, has collaborated with the Cambridge Public Health Department to write the latest edition of *Responding Effectively to Child Care Employees Facing Domestic Violence Handbook*; and
- WHEREAS: The handbook addresses the impact of domestic violence on child care employees who exhibit emotional distress, physical injuries, diminished work performance, increased absences, and the effect on children in their care; and
- WHEREAS: The handbook offers support strategies for the victims of violence and their coworkers; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council encourage city departments, and private and public businesses to use this handbook as a template for creating a suitable guide for their own use; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council recognize the work being done by the fifteen early childhood professionals organized as Domestic Violence Resource People and trained by the Cambridge Community Partnerships for Children to stop domestic violence in the early childhood community of Cambridge; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council go on record as congratulating Fran Roznowski, Early Childhood Support Specialist at the Cambridge Community Partnerships for Children; Marsha Lazar, Director of Community Health Programs at the Cambridge Public Health Department; and Gretchen Sherwood, former city-wide Violence Prevention Coordinator at the Cambridge Public Health Department for the publication of the newly revised edition of *Responding Effectively to Child Care Employees Facing Domestic Violence Handbook*; and be it further
