On January 27, 1992, at 0919 hours, Box 713 was struck for a fire at 81 Orchard Street. Off duty Fire Fighter Jay Milliken of Engine Company No. 4 was on the scene before arrival of fire department units.

Whereas:

Without regard for his own safety, Fire Fighter Milliken entered the buildings and supervised the egress of the occupants of the first and second floors. Fire Fighter Milliken, without protective clothing and equipment, then made a primary search of the attic-- which was heavily involved in fire.

Whereas:

Upon the arrival of the first Engine Company, F.F. Milliken assisted in the stretching and advancement of hose lines.

I commend Fire Fighter Milliken for his actions at Box 2-713 on January 27, 1992. His conduct and service were in keeping with the highest traditions of the Cambridge Fire Department.
