In the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six.

An Ordinance,
prescribing the manner of recording the Ordinances
of the City.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City
of Cambridge, as follows:—

All Ordinances, which shall be passed by the
Mayor and Aldermen and by the Common Council
of said City, shall be engrossed or recorded by the
City Clerk in a fair and legible hand, without
interlineation or erasure, and in the order in
which they shall be passed, in a book to be kept
for that purpose, made of strong linen paper, with
proper margins and index, to be lettered,—"Record
of Ordinances of the City of Cambridge"; which book
shall be preserved in the Office of the City Clerk,
subject to the inspection of the citizens.
