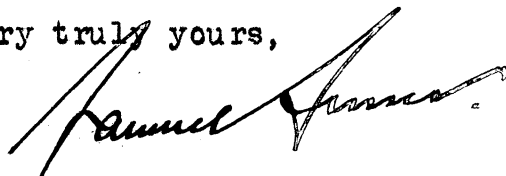

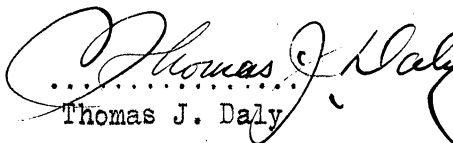
Honorable dear Sir:
