- WHEREAS: During his peak years, Thomas estimates he was umpiring 19 games a week during the summer season all of which he will miss, although he will not be completely leaving the sport since he will remain working as a park craftsman for the Department of Public Works where he has worked for the past 28 years; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deep appreciation to Thomas "Scarsy" Daley for his tireless dedication to the youths of this City and to further extend to him, every good wish for continued good health and happiness to him and his wife of 37 years, Ada, and be it further
