Vincent Saia of 147 Amery Street was stricken with a heart attack while being harassed by youths on Harvard Street on August 3, 1974, and

WHEREAS:

William D. Doody of 28 Bristol Street demonstrated the highest degree of humanitarianism by applying emergency first aid to Vincent Saia, and

WHEREAS:

The quick and decisive action by William D. Doody turned a near fatality into a happy ending by saving the life of Vincent Saia, as exemplified by Mr. Doody being awarded the Medal of Merit from the National Court of Honor as well as letters of commendation received by Mr. Doody from people such as Fire Lt. Joseph Roberts, Police Officer Richard Lyons and Dr. Seigl of the Cambridge Hospital, now therefore be it

That this City Council go on record extending our sincere appreciation for his humanitarian acts in behalf of another human being, and be it further

RESOLVED:

That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a copy of this resolution to Mr. William D. Doody as a token of our appreciation.
