AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT OF CAMBRIDGE POLICE OFFICERS HIRED FROM THE 1972 POLICE EXAMINATION

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1.

Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law or rule to the contrary, solely for the purpose of determining the rate of withholdings required by paragraph (b) of subdivision (1) of section twenty-two of chapter thirty-two of the General Laws, that all current police officers in the City of Cambridge that were hired from the 1972 police examination, shall be deemed to have entered the service of said City on December seventeen, nineteen hundred and seventy-four.

The retirement system of the City of Cambridge is hereby authorized and directed to pay to these officers in one sum the amount equal to the difference between (i) the amounts actually withheld from the compensation of said officers and deposited in the annuity savings fund system; and (ii) the amounts which would have been withheld had said officers become members in service of said system on said date, together with
