Mr. Liveright's promising TV career was cut short during the Red Scare of the 1950s, the anti-communist crusade orchestrated by Senator Joseph McCarthy. In 1956, Mr. Liveright was subpoenaed to testify before the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee about his political beliefs and associations. He refused to answer the committee's questions, believing he was protected by the First Amendment. He was fired the next day by WDSU, and he and his family, threatened with harm because of their publicized left-wing sentiments, fled Louisiana.
