WHEREAS: In 1944, four Harvard students attended the first meeting of what would become the Harvard-Radcliffe Hillel: a spiritual, cultural and intellectual center for the University's Jewish community; and

WHEREAS: During its first fifty years, Harvard-Radcliffe Hillel has played a defining role in shaping the lives of countless Harvard and Radcliffe students; and

WHEREAS: Throughout its history, Harvard-Radcliffe Hillel has played an active role in the Cambridge community and throughout the world, from providing food for Cambridge homeless shelters to raising money for the victims of the war in Bosnia; and

WHEREAS: The Harvard-Radcliffe Hillel has come to outgrow its present home at the venerable Riesman Center on 74 Mount Auburn Street; and

WHEREAS: After a long, difficult, but ultimately successful effort, The Harvard-Radcliffe Hillel will be moving into a new home, The Riesman Center in Rosovsky Hall at 52 Mount Auburn Street in Harvard Square, across the street from its current location; and

WHEREAS: The dedication of the new Hillel will take place on Sunday, May 1, 1994 at 1 o'clock in the afternoon, beginning with a procession from the old Riesman Center to Rosovsky Hall and ending with a concert by Mizmor Shir, the Hillel student chorus; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this Cambridge City Council does hereby congratulate the staff, officers, students, alumni, board of directors, and friends of the Harvard-Radcliffe Hillel on the occasion of the dedication of its new home in Rosovsky Hall; and be it further

RESOLVED: That all members of the Cambridge and Harvard communities are encouraged to take part in this wonderful celebration of the rich history and diversity of Judaism at Harvard and Radcliffe.
