- WHEREAS: Leo was born in Cambridge, graduated from Cambridge High and Latin School, attended Suffolk University and subsequently served aboard the USS Harry Lee during World War II; and
- WHEREAS: Leo was employed by the Massachusetts Division of Insurance for thirty years and served for a time as the Director of Retirement Systems and also as a member of the Massachusetts State Retirement Board; and
- WHEREAS: In addition to being a past member of the Cambridge Lodge of Elks, Leo was, up until 1977, the owner and operator of the Blue and Gold Club, a Cambridge lounge founded by his father; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Elizabeth Manley and the entire Manley family at this time of their deep personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and is hereby requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the Manley family on behalf of the entire City Council.
