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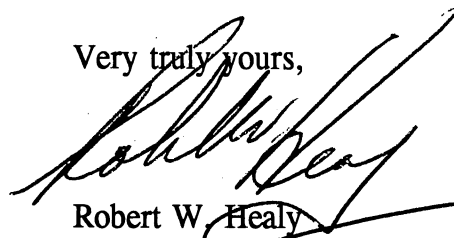

To The Honorable, The City Council:

I am hereby transmitting for your review and action an appropriation of a grant for \$36,900.00 from the Massachusetts Committee on Criminal Justice to the Police Department Other Ordinary Maintenance Account for the purchase of CRIMCON Latent Fingerprint Processing equipment.

CRIMCON is a new technology which allows for the capture of latent images at crime scenes often from surfaces that have traditionally been unreadable. CRIMCON will also allow for quick and easy retrieval and processing of latent evidence. The system consists of four separate components. The Department's match will be in the form of training expenses and processing supplies.
