WHEREAS: Head Track Coach Jamalh Prince, Track Coach Jesse Cody, Head Cross-Country Coach and Distance Track Coach Scott Cody, and Sprinters Coach Pershing Reid are all alumni of Cambridge Rindge and Latin High School; and

WHEREAS: Jamalh Prince was named "Coach of the Year" in 1999 by the Boston Globe helping coach Cambridge to its first boys State indoor track title since 1991, and for his record in outdoor track of 29-3 since he became Head Coach in 1994; and

WHEREAS: Jamalh Prince was a three time Massachusetts state champion in the mile and contributed to seven state titles in cross-country, indoor and outdoor track for Cambridge Rindge; and

WHEREAS: Jesse Cody was State Champion seven times in cross-country, indoor and outdoor track and contributed to Cambridge's four state titles, and helped coach this year's winning state boys indoor track team; and

WHEREAS: Scott Cody was a five time state champion in cross-country, indoor and outdoor track, helped lead Cambridge to seven state titles, guided the 1998 boys cross-country team to its state title and, with coaching assistance from Curtis Jackman, the girls indoor track team won the first Greater Boston League title in many years; and

WHEREAS: Pershing Reid has been a devoted volunteer coach for ten years, is a "father figure" in the sport of track and field, and truly loves to teach athletes about commitment, values and the ups and downs of competition; and

WHEREAS: The boys cross-country team has honored the City of Cambridge this school year winning the Class A state championships in the fall; and

WHEREAS: The boys indoor track team also honored the City of Cambridge this school year winning the Greater Boston League, the Class A state championship and the All State championship; and

WHEREAS: Further honoring the City of Cambridge was the girls indoor track team winning the Greater Boston League championship for the first time in many years; and

WHEREAS: The boys and girls track and cross country athletes have pushed themselves to compete and achieve their highest goals; now therefore be it

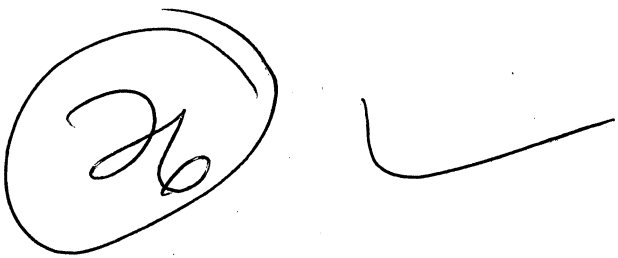
