- WHEREAS: Speakers will include Mr. Charles B. Walker, Prince Hall Historian, and Mr. Frederick Summers, who will present a narration of the history of Boston's African Meeting House; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council congratulate all those whose efforts went into creating this important event, and particularly honor Mr. Charles F. Cox, co-founder of the Prince Hall Black History Program, who died in 1985, and to whom the 1991 Program is dedicated; and be it further
