- WHEREAS: The nation is now celebrating the 25th anniversary of the CDBG Program's success in providing a better quality of life for urban Americans – mainly for those of low and moderate income; and
- WHEREAS: Cambridge residents have benefited greatly from CDBG-funded progress in affordable housing, human services, economic development and community planning provided by City departments and Cambridge non-profit organizations; and
- WHEREAS: The CDBG Program – proposed and established by President Nixon's Administration in 1974 – has since then suffered a real-dollars funding reduction of nearly 70%; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council hereby proclaim June, 1999 as Cambridge Community Development Month and request that during this month celebrations of both CDBG and HOME-funded projects in Cambridge be held; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Council hereby requests the leadership of the United States Congress to restore CDBG, HOME and related programs to their original funding levels; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Council requests Cambridge residents, businesses and organizations to contact their members of Congress about this funding need; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Council requests the City Manager to send Congress both this resolution and an accompanying report on current and past CDBG/HOME projects that improved living conditions for the people of Cambridge.
