RESOLVED:

That the Cambridge City Council establish a "good faith" three month moratorium in Cambridge on laboratory research involving recombinant DNA molecules at the P3 and P4 levels so that all concerned can properly review relevant testimony, and be it further

RESOLVED:

That the Council use all available powers to see to it that the moratorium is respected.
