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Mack I. Davis 2d, assistant dean at Harvard, clinical psychologist

Mack I. Davis 2d, a clinical psychologist and assistant dean of Harvard University's faculty of arts and sciences, died of an aneurysm Tuesday at his home in Cambridge. He was 45.

Mr. Davis joined Harvard in 1970 as a teaching fellow in social relations and in 1971 became an assistant in the Bureau of Student Counsel, the university's remedial teaching laboratory.

In 1970, as a research associate at Harvard's Graduate School of Education, he joined the Pathways to Identity Project: A Longitudinal Study in Black Adolescence. Assistant dean since 1974, Mr. Davis also served as director of advanced standing at Harvard College, acting director of the Bureau of Student Counsel and as a member of Board of Freshman Advisors.

L. Fred Jewett, dean of the college, said: "Mack was a wonderful colleague and close friend who made many contributions to the life of the college in a number of ways, both as teacher and counselor."

Mr. Davis graduated from Boston University in 1966. He also earned a master's degree in philosophy at the New School for Social

Research in New York and a master's in education and a doctorate in clinical psychology at Harvard.

He was a psychological consultant to the Boston Model Cities Administration, the Salvation Army, the National Basketball Association and the Greenwich (Conn.) school system, among other organizations. He was a director of the Cambridge School Volunteers, Massachusetts Planned Parenthood and the International Women's Health Coalition.

Mr. Davis leaves his wife, Shelley (Lazerson); a son, Manuel L.; his parents, Dr. and Mrs. Mack Davis of Alton, Ill.; and a sister, Sheila Gregory.

A service will be held tomorrow at noon in Memorial Church in Harvard Yard.
