COUNCILLOR WALTER SULLIVAN

- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of Dr. Thomas Trainor, a native Cantabrigian and long time Dental Surgeon in Arlington and Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: Dr. Trainor attended local schools and graduated from Boston College High School in 1928, from Holy Cross College in 1932 and from McGill University in Canada in 1938, where he received his Doctorate in Dental Surgery and upon graduation from McGill, undertook his residency at Bellevue Hospital in New York City; and
- WHEREAS: Dr. Trainor served his country well during World War II as a Lieutenant Commander in the United States Navy, assigned to the Naval Dental Corps and upon his honorable discharge began his active dental practice where he adopted the technique of using nitrous oxide as a general anesthesia, a practice he later taught while serving as Chief of the Department of Dentistry at the Cambridge Hospital, a position he held until 1965; and
- WHEREAS: Dr. Trainor continued to practice until his retirement in 1980 after forty-two years of both general dentistry and oral surgery; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Mrs. Marcia Trainor and the Trainor family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mrs. Trainor on behalf of the entire City Council.

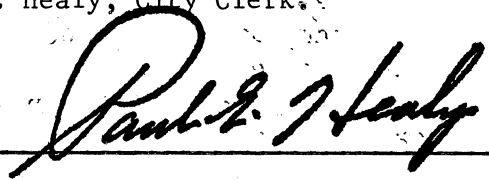
