- WHEREAS: Taxpayers of Cambridge are seriously concerned why at this time of fiscal crisis in the Commonwealth, that Cambridge is creating a new position of Police Commissioner which is being advertised presently, and the salary, plus benefits and additional personnel which would follow would alleviate some of the shortages that would happen if CLT should pass; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested not to fill the position of Police Commissioner pending the outcome of the CLT petition; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That if the CLT petition is approved by the voters of Massachusetts, that the position of Police Commissioner be eliminated and the money saved be applied to the impending budget cuts.
