Abner R. Sisson, 89, lawyer & professor

Abner R. Sisson of Newton, a personal injury attorney who pioneered the use of graphic courtroom evidence in defending his clients, died at home Monday. He was 89.

Born in Boston, Mr. Sisson entered Suffolk University Law School at the age of 17. Since the 1930s, he practiced law in Boston after renting his first office for \$33 a month with a law school friend.

Mr. Sisson, an adjunct professor of civil trial advocacy at Suffolk University Law School in 1970, worked for more than 60 years in the state and federal courts.

A member of the Boston, Middlesex, Massachusetts and American Bar Associations, Mr. Sisson was a founder and member of the board of governors of the Massachusetts Academy of

Trial Attorneys and a member of the board of governors and associate editor for the Association of Trial Lawyers of America.

An advocate and director of the national board of the American Board of Trial Advocates, Mr. Sisson was also a trustee of the Roscoe Pound Foundation and a fellow of the International Society of Barristers and the American College of Trial Lawyers.

Husband of the late Harriet (Howell), Mr. Sisson is survived by a daughter, Gay S. Bomes of Boca Raton, Fla.; four grandchildren; and six great-grandchildren.

A funeral service will be held at 10:30 a.m. today at the Levine Chapel, Brookline.

Burial will be in Temple Israel Cemetery, Wakefield.
