Mr. Simonian's first major decision was the one he remains best known for - the demolition of the West End. In 1960, the neighborhood near Beacon Hill was home to 7,000 people representing 23 nationalities who lived in brick tenements on a 48-acre tract behind Beacon Hill from Massachusetts General Hospital to North Station. Everybody thought it was a slum, except the people living there. Today it is Charles River Park, a complex of towers with more than 2,000 apartments, offices, stores, and recreational facilities.
