- WHEREAS: On Tuesday, September 23, 1980 at 5:58 p. m. four officers of the Cambridge Police Department responded to an emergency call at 51 Clifton Street where a person armed with a loaded twelve gauge shotgun threatened the lives and safety of the entire neighborhood, and
- WHEREAS: Police Officers Francis Corcoran, James Dwyer, Paul Oppedisano and William Slivinski with complete disregard for their personal safety and by their restraint and patience succeeded in subduing and disarming this troubled person saving his life and preventing possible loss of life to the members of this neighborhood, and
- WHEREAS: The conduct of these officers in this time of great stress was in keeping with the highest traditions of the Cambridge Police Department and earned the respect and admiration of this City Council and the citizens of Cambridge and should be recognized and publicly acknowledged, therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That His Honor, the Mayor be and hereby is requested to arrange an appropriate public ceremony to record their courage and dedication to duty in the City that they serve so well, and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare suitably engrossed copies of this resolution for presentation to Officers Francis Corcoran, James Dwyer, Paul Oppedisano and William Slivinski and that copies of the action by this City Council be entered in their personnel files and in the records of the City Council.
