ORDERED: That the City Manager confer with the Police commissioner to prepare a report to the Council about all four of these incidents and any others like them which have occurred in the last year, including in the reports the origin and destination of the trucks, the owners, the circumstances and exact locations of the accidents, the type of material carried, and whether, given their origins and destinations, these trucks could have chosen an alternate route on limited access, non residential roadway like Rt. 93, 95 and the Mass Pike.
