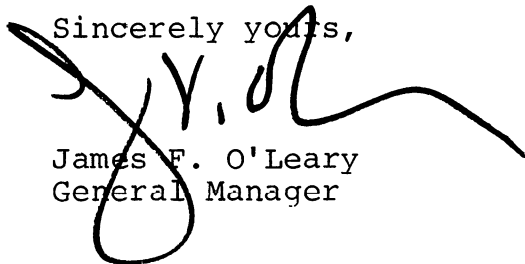
Dear Mr. Healy: *R.W.*
