The Honorable, the City Council:

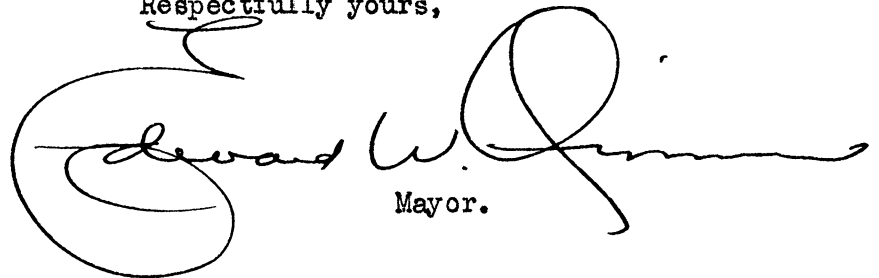
It becomes my sad duty to announce officially to you the death of Mr. Clement G. Morgan which occurred on Saturday, June 1.

Mr. Morgan had lived in this city about all of his life time. During the years 1895 and 1896 he was a member of the old Common Council, and in 1897, 1898 and 1899 he was a member of the Board of Aldermen, in all of which time he served his fellow-citizens faithfully and well.

While a student at Harvard College he was conspicuous by reason of his oratory and ability in debate. He never lost interest in all things pertaining to the welfare of Cambridge, being frequently called upon to serve his fellow-citizens in many ways. He always responded and gave generously of his time.

I respectfully recommend that you Board adopt suitable resolutions in respect to his memory, in which action I am ready to join.
